It's hard to believe that it was 25 years ago that Steve Edge & Margaret Whale, Stephen Fearing, Jane Gowan, and Rick Costigan met on Steve's Kitsilano lawn to discuss the formation of the Rogue Folk Club. The first concert was at The Savoy in Gastown, and Stephen Fearing was our house band. Since then we've moved to The Railway Club, Isadora's, and The Anza Club (all very briefly when The Savoy was sold in 1988) before finding a new home at the WISE Hall in the East End. 15 years later they tripled our rent and made it clear that we were no longer welcome. Meanwhile we'd presented a few shows at St. James Hall over the years when the WISE wasn't available, and they welcomed us with open arms. Since January 2004 we've made our home at the former church now a Community Centre - in Kitsilano.

We've presented over 1,500 concerts, in a huge variety of musical styles and genres: take a look at Roguestory on our website and marvel at the length, breadth and quality of that list of performers! 25 years ago, Vancouver found a new outlet for Roots Music in all its rich variety at The Rogue Folk Club! The following article appeared in the Westender (WE) newspaper on April 11. It was written by Curtis Woloschuk:

ver the past six years, Van Django have become a fixture at The Rogue Folk Club's annual **April in Paris** festival. In turn, violinist Cameron Wilson has noticed the gypsy jazz celebrated at the showcase becoming increasingly commonplace in the world around him. To wit, moviegoers recently swooned to Stéphane Wrembel's Bistro Fada, which set the mood for Woody Allen's Midnight in Paris, or caught a glimpse of legendary guitarist Diango Reinhardt (as portrayed by Emil Lager) in Martin Scorsese's Hugo. Just as those



two films looked back fondly at bygone eras, Wilson is prone to waxing rhapsodic about his earliest encounters with gypsy jazz. "When I was 13, I heard (violinist and Reinhardt collaborator) Stéphane Grappelli play in concert," he recalls. "It was kind of life changing. Then, I had a junior high school English teacher who was really into Diango and played guitar. He would bring these charts to school and we'd jam at lunch hour," he continues. "He had all of these Stéphane Grappelli records I'd never heard before. It was mind-blowing."

Some years later, Wilson crossed paths with another guitarist - Budge **Schachte** — and formed Van Django, which now includes cellist/guitarist Finn Manniche and bassist Brent Gubbels.

In addition to tackling Reinhardt standards like "Djangology" and "Belleville," the quartet also pen their own material, which features heavily on their second album, Waltz in the Shape of a Tree, released in conjunction with their April 20 show at St. James Hall.

While Wilson's admiration for Grappelli has never waned, his playing style is equally indebted to Joe Vinuti and Stuff Smith. "He swung harder than anyone," he marvels of Smith. In terms of how their pieces are assembled, "A lot of it is just instinctive... You throw in the odd country music lick... Some classical motifs and harmonies... Some pop music too..." Van Django have now added The Beatles' A Day in the Life to their repertoire. In terms of how they found their way into the multi-movement anthem, he explains, "The second section where it gets faster — 'Woke up/Fell out of bed...' — is almost swing. Then, we threw in a little of Django's 'Minor Swing.' It's sort of like a casserole. Then, there's a little George Harrison quote near the end."


To Wilson's way of thinking, it's this sense of of experimentation that separates North American gypsy jazz players from their European brethren, who tend to stick to standards. "The European gypsy jazz is more authentic. It has more attitude and panache," he admits. "I think we bring our own eclectic sense of mixing and matching genres. We're open to making it more our own."

/ancouver's Hot Club of Mars has been swinging for a few spins around the sun — a dozen earth years or so though things really started heating up when performance songwriter, Deanna "D" Knight landed on the red planet in 2002. Acoustic bassist Charlie Knowles "kicks the cat" with finesse while guitarist Steve "Bugzy" Szabo keeps the rhythms chugging. Martian Ambassador Michael Dunn and recent arrival Don Kellett spin their sweet Diangoesque lines on lead slide and guitars, and resident windgod Mark Dowding, keeps those Martian desert winds blowing hot. The newest Martian import, violinist Tom Neville, channels the spirit of the late great Stephane Grappelli rounding out the sound to a full acoustic orchestra of roots jazz. They have been hard at work on their second CD, and have a wealth of new songs and tunes to share.

ioneers in a men's musical world and precursors of the manouche wave swelling all over Québec, Christine Tassan et Les Imposteures offer an exquisite tour of a unique universe. Rarely do we see an entirely feminine jazz group and it is especially unique in Gypsy jazz. These musicians have great energy, and their pleasure in performing is contagious. Last year they wowed our audience with their original songs, glorious vocal harmonies, Django / manouche songs delivered with panache and joie de vivre, and of course, instrumentals giving way to fabulously wild improvs with the violin and the guitar. The quartet is in the studio this month to record their 3rd CD, and they will have plenty of new music to present on their return engagement at April In Paris!

unny and upbeat, with just a pinch of sass, the Good Lovelies' textbook three-part harmonies, constant instrument swapping and witty on-stage banter have enlivened the folk music landscape since they joined forces in 2006 for their first show at Toronto's funky Gladstone Hotel.

Let the Rain Fall, their third full-length album, was recently nominated for the 2012 Juno for Roots/Traditional Album of the Year. With equal parts city and country, highway and home, wistfulness and sass, the Good Lovelies' good humour and self-assurance shines through from the toe-tapping start of "Made for Rain" to the sweet final notes in the French-flecked "Mrs. T." In between, you'll hear reflections on urban imperfections with "Backyard", straight-up love songs like "Best I Know" and upbeat numbers like "Kiss Me in the Kitchen."
