Since being awarded the title of *Best Up* Alba Scots Trad Music Awards, **The Paul McKenna Band** have gone from strength to strength touring extensively throughout USA, Canada and Europe. Combining their love for Folk and Traditional music, as well as original songs and tunes; The Paul McKenna Band has been captivating audiences with live performances of their new album, titled **Stem the Tide**, out now on Greentrax Records. Concert highlights of 2011 included performances at The Cambridge Folk Festival England, Tonder Festival Denmark, Milwaukee Irish Festival USA and Goderich Festival Canada. 2012 got off to a flying start with a headline performance at the internationally acclaimed **Celtic Connections Festival** at the Glasgow Royal Concert Hall. With a contemporary approach to songs, although not straying too far from their roots, their arrangements are both fresh & innovative.

The exciting sound of The Paul McKenna Band is created through outstanding Vocals, driving Guitar and Bouzouki, intense fiddle playing, a warm pairing of flute and whistles and dynamic bodhrán and percussion. They made their Rogue debut in March 2011 and since then have released their second CD, "Stem The Tide", and been reinforced with the addition of ace Scots fiddler **Mike Vass. www.paulmckennaband.com**

An Incredible Summer!

Steve & Margaret managed to make it to no less than six festivals on successive weekends in July and August, and Steve was working at five of them (as an MC at Island Musicfest, Mission, and Shorefest, and a Radio Host at Vancouver.) Edmonton was a nice, relaxing finale - if you can call a four-day party in the hot sun with 30,000 people "relaxing!"

Introducing **Richard Thompson** at Island Musicfest was a thrill! (Incidentally, he will be at Saltspring Folk Club on October 15th.) Steve interviewed CBC's **Holger Petersen** and hosted an amazing gospel workshop in The Barn.

Steve and Linda Bull co-hosted The Edge On Folk live from Jericho Park at the Vancouver Folk Festival, with live performances by Dala, The Once, Atomic Duo and more. Sadly, Steve only enjoyed Johnny Clegg's main stage set. He felt that all the others were way too loud and / or distorted (or maybe he's getting too old for this!)

Rain spoiled the opening night at Mission, and **Shooglenifty** were a pale imitation of their usual, bouncy selves. The rest of the weekend was fabulous, with **The Teetotallers** (Martin Hayes, Kevin Crawford & John Doyle) stealing the show. **Colum Sands**, Swedish band **Lyy**, and **Buffy Ste-Marie** were also amazing.

Shorefest ran for 3 nights before the fireworks and the Rogue Stage at Sunset Beach saw some incredible performances, including Harry Manx, Viper Central, Headwater, and Jim Byrnes & Steve Dawson. Look for Steve's Festival Reports coming to the website soon.

Alt-folk singer-songwriter Christa Couture launches her new album The Living Record with a cross-Canada tour, starting at The Rogue with a full band. The new CD was produced by Steve Dawson and he features in the band on the disc and at the show - alongside Rob Becker on bass, Chris Gestrin on keyboards, and Niko Friesen on drums.

Christa's new album is as difficult to sum up in a few words as the Mona-Lisa-like expression on her face on the cover shot. To say that it's about "maturing through loss" will sound terribly cliché to those unfamiliar with her story; Couture is an adolescent cancer survivor whose last album was inspired in part by the death of her infant son ... and who has had to endure even more loss as she's sought to get back on her feet. And yet, to say it's inspired by such tragedy leaves one singularly unprepared for the sound: bright, beautifullyorchestrated indie folk; sweet, idiosyncratic vocals reminiscent of artists like Regina Spektor and Jane Siberry; a luscious palette of sonic styles - fuzzy guitar, bluegrass-style pickin', soulful cello, quirky chorus-like vocal arrangements and a touch of cabaret - and not a moment of self-indulgence to be found.

The Living Record is ultimately an album about living - the aftermath of loss interwoven with new wisdom and experiences. She grew up in Edmonton with a mother who sang in a folk trio

and a father who performed First Nations ceremonial music. She sang in choirs and performed in musical theatre, and then moved to Vancouver to study at Vancouver Film School. She worked in film and television for about a decade before returning to music and releasing Fell Out Of Oz in 2005. Her second CD, The Wedding Singer and the Undertaker, won a 2008 Canadian Aboriginal Music Award for Best Folk Acoustic Album, and was Top 10 at CBC Radio 3 and went to #1 on the National Aboriginal Music Countdown. PopMatters praised her "writerly, at times even playful, skill with words, as well as uplifting production." The same can be said about The Living Record, for while its story is uncommonly sad, it is transformed by Couture's equally uncommon talent.

We begin the evening with a set from American songwriter **SONIA** of Disappear Fear (photo, below right.) She is a powerful singer and a fine guitarist and pianist as well. A peace activist, and one of America's most passionate voices for tolerance, hope and justice, SONiA travels the world spreading her message of peace, love and hope.

Last year she teamed up with her sister, Cindy, to re-form Disappear Fear and produced a CD of Phil Ochs songs - Get Your Phil - proving that she remains one of the most impressive interpreters of the late songwriter's work, while also adding a freshness and subtle power to the arrangements (especially noteworthy is her juxtaposition of Ochs' "I've Had Her" with Bruce Springsteen / Patti Smith's "Because the Night".) Her latest solo CD, Blood Bones and Baltimore is another tour de force, and her engaging presence, winning smile, and the sheer passion of her songs and message has won her legions of fans around the world. It's time for Vancouver to celebrate her remarkable words of wisdom!

The Bills are back! New album to save world with optimism! This merry band of freewheeling roots phenoms is exactly what the world needs right now - the antidote to every bad news story about the sorry state of civilization. Bursting with exuberance and West Coast joie de vivre, these two-time Juno nominees and one-time WCMA Entertainers of the Year combine ebullient string arrangements, unparalleled song-craft, soaring harmonies, and spry lonesome lead vocals into songs that celebrate the treasures of human experience - like the community halls that stitch together the fabric of Canadian life, the effervescent face of a child that makes a 4 a.m. wake-up call worthwhile, and the insanely hot peppers in producer Joby Baker's homemade hot sauce. They also challenge the prophets of economic and environmental doom with "Not the End," a song that wisely proclaims, "It fell down before but it grew back again." But just in case there is an apocalypse, The Bills have also hedged their bets by recording a shiny, happy tribute to the evil horticultural nemeses that will survive it: "Blackberry, Ivy, and Broom." And how can you not laugh when you realize that the seemingly universal anthem about interdependence in relationships is actually Marc Atkinson's song about repeatedly almost killing his house plant out of abject negligence?







Of course, this boundless positivity, mischievous humour, and totally-overthe-top outstanding musicianship is precisely what rocketed The Bills to the forefront of the Canadian and international roots circuit in the first place. They've performed at the Kennedy Center; toured the U.K. and Scandinavia; played all the famous folk clubs, like the Ark in Ann Arbor and Freight and Salvage in Berkeley; and had their music featured on the Rough Guide's "Music of Canada" compilation. They've also received glowing reviews from the Boston Herald, Austin INsite, and Utne Reader. They've performed at Celtic Connections in Glasgow, the fabled Strawberry Music Festival in Yosemite, California, and Ottawa's B.C. Scene. Here in Canada, they've played all the big festivals, sold out folk clubs sometimes for multiple nights - earned TWO consecutive Juno nominations for Roots and Traditional Album of the Year (group) and won Western Canadian Music Awards for Outstanding Roots Recording and Entertainer of the Yeabeating Jann Arden and Michael Bublé!

If they weren't already a super-group when they formed back in 1996, they certainly are now. Guitarist Marc Atkinson has earned WCMA nominations with his eponymous hot jazz ensemble - whose second album was voted one of the top five albums in North America by Acoustic Guitar magazine. Bills vocalist Chris Frye was the rhythm guitarist in Marc's trio for ten years and appears on all their albums. He released a WCMA-nominated album of his own in 2006, featuring the Wailin' Jennys, Mae Moore and Oh Susanna. 

John Doyle -Shadow and Light Compass Records Irishman John

Doyle first appeared on the scene as a very tal-

ented guitar player providing accompaniment in **Solas** and with **Eileen Ivers**. Soon it became apparent that he could play with a wide range of musicians, and he has recorded with and produced for many of today's top artists such as **Karan Casey, Kate Rusby, Michael Mc-Goldrick, Liz Carroll** - even **Joan Baez**.

As the first of his own albums appeared it was revealed that he was also a composer of tunes, an excellent singer, and with this third one it emerges he is also a skilful songwriter.

He spins a good yarn too, touching on several themes, and favours songs with a historical narrative evoking the lives and stories of people who have faced the harsh realities of life. The first tells the tale of the Irish Volunteers, a regiment that lost big during the American Civil War. Another recounts the tragedy of the poor Irish who emigrated in desperation during the Great Famine of the 1840s only to suffer further during the arduous sea voyage. Many of them ended up in a large cemetery in Gross Ile, Quebec. Then there is a number dealing with Doyle's own greatgrandfather's ill fated attempt to emigrate, and the touching story of another man driven abroad by a broken heart. The account of the Irish who fought for England in WW1 is one of hardship and betrayal, and there's a song too dealing with the perils of drink that can ruin a person's life.

There is tenderness though as well, in a personal look at a father's delight in and love for his child, and also a telling of the mythical story of the Selkie. The one cover is Doyle's fine take on the grand old ballad **Botany Bay**. As well there are two sets of tunes, a couple of them slow and tender, and a couple more of the kick-up-your heels variety.

John is a consummate musician, sings with both strength and subtlety, and plays a fabulous guitar, or rather a selection of different guitars, with dazzling skill and inventiveness.

Here and there other musicians provide some background colour and a few solo turns, but it really is the man himself in the spotlight, offering compelling music and astute story-telling. There is indeed shadow and light on this disc, and quite a few other shades in between. This release is a fine listen from beginning to end.
